HOLY FAMILY PARISH

**First Reading. Ezekiel 34:11-12,15-17;**

The Lord says this: I am going to look after my flock myself and keep all of it in view. As a shepherd keeps all his flock in view when he stands up in the middle of his scattered sheep, so shall I keep my sheep in view. I shall rescue them from wherever they have been scattered during the mist and darkness. I myself will pasture my sheep, I myself will show them where to rest – it is the Lord who speaks. I shall look for the lost one, bring back the stray, bandage the wounded and make the weak strong. I shall watch over the fat and healthy. I shall be a true shepherd to them. As for you, my sheep, the Lord says this: I will judge between sheep and sheep, between rams and he-goats.

Second Reading. 1 Corinthians 15:20-26,28;

Christ has been raised from the dead, the first-fruits of all who have fallen asleep. Death came through one man and in the same way the resurrection of the dead has come through one man. Just as all men die in Adam, so all men will be brought to life in Christ; but all of them in their proper order: Christ as the first-fruits and then, after the coming of Christ, those who belong to him. After that will come the end, when he hands over the kingdom to God the Father, having done away with every sovereignty, authority and power. For he must be king until he has put all his enemies under his feet and the last of the enemies to be destroyed is death, for everything is to be put under his feet. And when everything is subjected to him, then the Son himself will be subject in his turn to the One who subjected all things to him, so that God may be all in all.

Gospel. Matthew 25:31-46;

Jesus said to his disciples: 'When the Son of Man comes in his glory, escorted by all the angels, then he will take his seat on his throne of glory. All the nations will be assembled before him and he will separate men one from another as the shepherd separates sheep from goats. He will place the sheep on his right hand and the goats on his left.


'Then the King will say to those on his right hand, "Come, you whom my Father has blessed, take for your heritage the kingdom prepared for you since the foundation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me food; I was thirsty and you gave me drink; I was a stranger and you made me welcome; naked and you clothed me, sick and you visited me, in prison and you came to see me." Then the virtuous will say to him in reply, "Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you; or thirsty and give you drink? When did we see you a stranger and make you welcome; naked and clothe you; sick or in prison and go to see you?" And the King will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you did this to one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did it to me."

'Next he will say to those on his left hand, "Go away from me, with your curse upon you, to the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you never gave me food; I was thirsty and you never gave me anything to drink; I was a stranger and you never made me welcome, naked and you never clothed me, sick and in prison and you never visited me." Then it will be their turn to ask, "Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty, a stranger or naked, sick or in prison, and did not come to your help?" Then he will answer, "I tell you solemnly, in so far as you neglected to do this to one of the least of these, you neglected to do it to me."

 Chiara Badano was born on October 29, to Ruggero and Maria Theresa Badano in Sassello, Italy.

The couple waited and prayed 11 years to have Chiara. She was to be their only child.

While Ruggero worked as a truck driver, Maria Theresa stayed at home to raise Chiara.

childhood

Even at the age of four, Chiara seemed aware of the needs of others. She would sort through her toys to give some to poor children, and would never give away just the old or broken ones.

 She discovers the Focolare movement. This group, especially its founder's Chiara Lubich, had a profound impact on Chiara's life.

adolescence

She was popular amongst her friends. Chiara loved to hang out in coffee shops. She was great at tennis, swimming and hiking, she loved to sing and dance. Her dream is to become a flight attendant.



sickness

1988
 While playing tennis, she felt a sharp pain in her shoulder. It turned out to be bone cancer.

1989
 In February, she undergoes her first surgery. She accepts the outcome courageously. "I'm young. I'm sure I'll make it,"

In July, the tumour spreads quickly. She loses the use of her legs.

When she suffered, she felt closer to Jesus. She would say, "It's for you, Jesus; if You want it, I want it too."



departure

1990
 When Chiara realized that she was not going to get better, she started to plan for her "wedding" (her funeral) with her mother.

She chose the music, songs, flowers, and the readings for Mass. She wanted to be buried in her "wedding dress" a white dress with a pink waist, because her death would allow her to become the bride of Christ. She had also arranged to donate her corneas after her death.

She says to her mother: "Don't shed any tears for me. I'm going to Jesus. At my funeral, I don't want people crying, but singing with all their hearts."

She died on October 7, the Feast Day of the Holy Rosary.



Two days later, hundreds and hundreds of people, especially youths, take part in the funeral celebrated by "her" bishop.

 On September 25, she became the first member of Generation X to be beatified.
