FIRST READING : Genesis 18:1-10

The Lord appeared to Abraham at the Oak of Mamre while he was sitting by the entrance of the tent during the hottest part of the day. He looked up, and there he saw three men standing near him. As soon as he saw them he ran from the entrance of the tent to meet them, and bowed to the ground. 'My lord,' he said 'I beg you, if I find favour with you, kindly do not pass your servant by. A little water shall be brought; you shall wash your feet and lie down under the tree. Let me fetch a little bread and you shall refresh yourselves before going further. That is why you have come in your servant's direction.' They replied, 'Do as you say.' Abraham hastened to the tent to find Sarah. 'Hurry,' he said 'knead three bushels of flour and make loaves.' Then running to the cattle Abraham took a fine and tender calf and gave it to the servant, who hurried to prepare it. Then taking cream, milk and the calf he had prepared, he laid all before them, and they ate while he remained standing near them under the tree. 'Where is your wife Sarah?' they asked him. 'She is in the tent' he replied. Then his guest said, 'I shall visit you again next year without fail, and your wife will then have a son.'

The mystery is Christ among you, your hope of glory: this is the Christ we proclaim, this is the wisdom in which we thoroughly train everyone and instruct everyone, to make them all perfect in Christ.

GOSPEL : Luke 10:38-42

Jesus came to a village, and a woman named Martha welcomed him into her house. She had a sister called Mary, who sat down at the Lord's feet and listened to him speaking. Now Martha who was distracted with all the serving said, 'Lord, do you not care that my sister is leaving me to do the serving all by myself? Please tell her to help me.' But the Lord answered: 'Martha, Martha,' he said 'you worry and fret about so many things, and yet few are needed, indeed only one. It is Mary who has chosen the better part; it is not to be taken from her.'

St John Bosco

Don Bosco (Father Bosco), Giovanni Melchiorre Bosco



John Bosco dedicated his life to the betterment and education of street children, juvenile delinquents, and other disadvantaged youth. He developed teaching methods based on love rather than punishment, a method that became known as the Salesian Preventive System. John Bosco educated the whole person, body and soul. A follower of the spirituality and philosophy of St Francis de Sales, Bosco dedicated his works to him when he founded the Salesians of Don Bosco, based in Turin.

1815

Born in Becchi, Italy on August 16, John was the youngest son of a peasant-farmer.

1817

When he was two years old his father Francesco died, leaving the support of three boys to the mother, Margaret Bosco.

1824

At the age of nine he had a mysterious dream, which led him to his future mission.

1829

Poverty prevented any serious attempt at schooling. He met Father Calosso, an elderly priest who recognized his exceptional intelligence and began tutoring him. John idolized him.

1831

John went to stay in Chieri public school.

1835

On Aug 5, he entered the seminary at Chieri.

1841

On June 5, he was ordained a priest, becoming known as Don Bosco.

Part of Don Bosco's work as a priest was to visit the prisons around Turin. Here he experienced first-hand the misery of many defenseless and vulnerable teenagers. Their plight made a deep impression on him.

Dec 8, he met Bartholomew Garelli, a local homeless boy. Don Bosco's kindness won the teenager over and soon he brought more friends to Don Bosco.

1842

Every Sunday afternoon Don Bosco and the boys would have picnic and a catechism lesson and evening prayers.



1843

Their numbers grew so great that Don Bosco had to rent field after field as they often outgrew them or were kicked out for being too noisy; it became a "Wandering Oratory" as Don Bosco called it.

Don Bosco began to beg, knock on doors, preach, and plead with the people of Turin to help him to care for all of these boys.

1846

On April 12, the "Wandering Oratory" finds its definitive location in Pinardi Shed.

Because of his long and serious illness, Don Bosco decided to return home for a while until his recovery was complete. When he returned to Turin his mother Margaret came with him and became mother to his boys.

1853

Realizing that many of them needed continuous help, he enlarged the oratory into a boy's home. There, youngsters could live and either work or attend classes in the city. To prepare boys for skilled labor. This was the first Catholic trade school in Italy.

1859

On Dec 18, he founded the Salesian Society.

1872

Don Bosco, with Mary Mazzarello, co-founded the Daughters of Mary Help of Christians (Salesian Sisters).

1875

Don Bosco opened more High Schools, Trade Schools and Youth Centres throughout Europe.

In 1875 Don Bosco's work spread to Argentina. From there they spread to the whole of South America.



1888

Don Bosco died on January 31.

1934

Don Bosco was canonized by Pope Pius XI on Easter Sunday, April 1.



Today the Salesians of Don Bosco are the third-largest order in the Catholic church with over 40,000 Salesian priests, brothers, sisters, and lay people working in 120 countries all over the world.

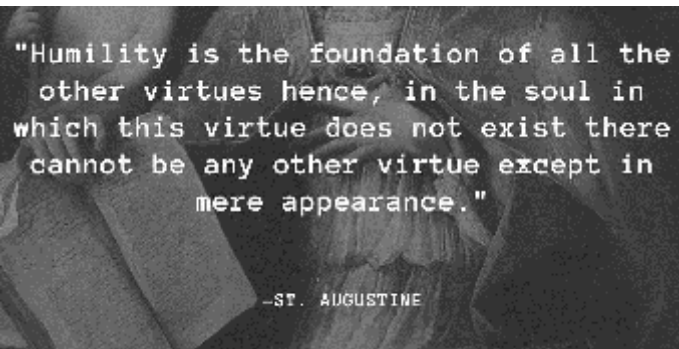
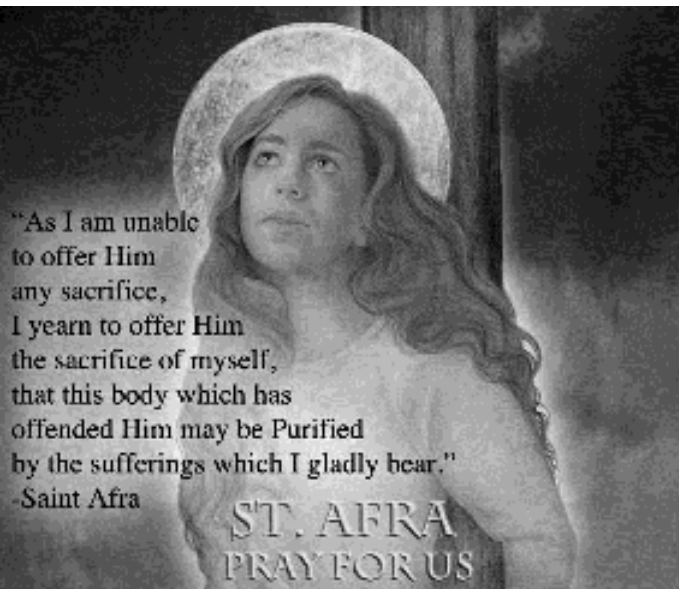

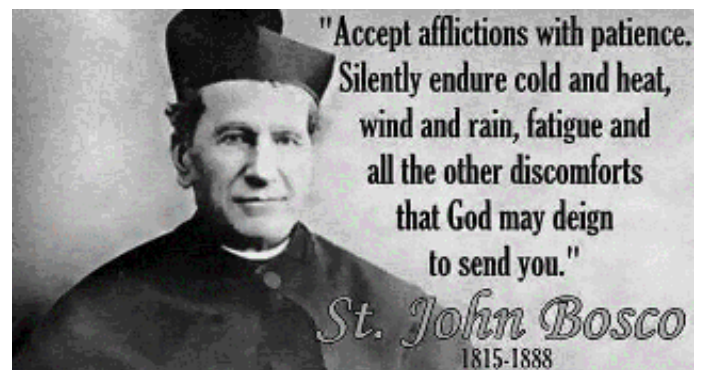

HEARTS AFLAME SUMMER SCHOOL 2023

Hearts Aflame Catholic Summer School happens every January. It is for anyone aged 18-35 (17 yr olds are considered) who wants to delve into the depth, breadth, beauty and wisdom of the Catholic faith. It is a ten-day event where approx. 120 participants live on-site, attend lectures, take part in a community, and experience the breadth of the Catholic tradition. It is not a youth camp or conference.

It as a 'summer school' because it's focused on formation and development – spiritual, intellectual, social.

Every day participants celebrate Mass and pray, share meals as a community, enjoy some free time, and have some lectures or talks on different aspects of the Catholic faith. It can be an intense experience, especially for the first half of the week as you adjust to the time spent in discussion, lectures, and prayer – but by the end of the school participants are in love with the 'rhythm of Hearts Aflame'!

Hearts Aflame begins on a Friday afternoon. The first three days – Friday to Sunday – are a retreat weekend, a time to step back from the world and listen intently to God. This retreat weekend is based on the theme of the school.

The next six days – Monday to Saturday – are the main part of the school. In the morning participants attend their chosen lecture series, then in the afternoon there are discussion groups and some free time. Each evening has a session with a unique focus and style – for example, our Catholic Cafe or our beloved 'Healing Adoration' night.

Sunday is focused on farewells, a clean up, and a final celebratory Mass before everyone heads home.

Hearts Aflame is full of fun, fellowship, formation, and Faith.
