FIRST READING: Exodus 22:20-26

The Lord said to Moses, 'Tell the sons of Israel this: "You must not molest the stranger or oppress him, for you lived as strangers in the land of Egypt. You must not be harsh with the widow, or with the orphan; if you are harsh with them, they will surely cry out to me, and be sure I shall hear their cry; my anger will flare and I shall kill you with the sword, your own wives will be widows, your own children orphans. "If you lend money to any of my people, to any poor man among you, you must not play the usurer with him: you must not demand interest from him. "If you take another's cloak as a pledge, you must give it back to him before sunset. It is all the covering he has; it is the cloak he wraps his body in; what else would he sleep in? If he cries to me, I will listen, for I am full of pity."

SECOND READING: 1 Thessalonians 1:5-10

You observed the sort of life we lived when we were with you, which was for your instruction, and you were led to become imitators of us, and of the Lord; and it was with the joy of the Holy Spirit that you took to the gospel, in spite of the great opposition all round you. This has made you the great example to all believers in Macedonia and Achaia since it was from you that the word of the Lord started to spread – and not only throughout Macedonia and Achaia, for the news of your faith in God has spread everywhere. We do not need to tell other people about it: other people tell us how we started the work among you, how you broke with idolatry when you were converted to God and became servants of the real, living God; and how you are now waiting for Jesus, his Son, whom he raised from the dead, to come from heaven to save us from the retribution which is coming.

GOSPEL: Matthew 22:34-40

When the Pharisees heard that Jesus had silenced the Sadducees they got together and, to disconcert him, one of them put a question, 'Master, which is the greatest commandment of the Law?' Jesus said, 'You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second resembles it: You must love your neighbour as yourself. On these two commandments hang the whole Law, and the Prophets also.'

HOW TO GAIN INDULGENCES FOR SOULS IN PURGATORY.

A brief outline on how to obtain a plenary indulgence for the Holy Souls in Purgatory.

Plenary indulgences for the Poor Souls

Six General rules for obtaining a plenary indulgence:

- 1.) State of grace at least when performing the indulgenced act
- 2.) Complete detachment from sin, even venial sin
- 3.) Confession (20 days before or after the indulgenced act)
- 4.) Communion (20 days before or after the indulgenced act)
- 5.) Prayers for the Supreme Pontiff (20 days before or after the indulgenced act)

Indulgenced act: a special good work with special conditions of place and time Indulgenced acts to be performed for obtaining a plenary indulgence:

- From November 1 to 8: visit of a cemetery with mental prayer for the poor souls.
- On November 2: visit of a church or an oratory with one Our Father and one Creed being recited.

A partial indulgence can be obtained any time by visiting a cemetery and praying for the Poor Souls. The following prayer is especially recommended:







Allhallowtide, Hallowtide, Allsaintstide, or the Hallowmas Season, is the Western/Latin Christian liturgical season, encompassing the triduum (3-fold celebration) of (1) ALL SAINTS' EVE (Halloween, Oct 31), (2) ALL SAINTS' DAY (All Hallows', Nov 1) and (3) ALL SOULS' DAY (Nov 2). Allhallowtide is a time to remember the dead, including martyrs, saints, and all faithful departed Christians. Children often dress-up as saints for the Solemnity of All Saints and visit Christian homes. The modern practice of "Halloween" – often obsessed with demons, ugliness, and sin – is a pagan and secular distortion of a once holy Christian practice. Modern secular "Halloween" should be avoided due to its connection to occultism, spiritism, the New Age, and its general mockery of Christian prayers.
